Vice President Jeff Fay called the meeting to order at 6:02 PM.

Jeff Fay opened the meeting by giving condolences for and memories of Tim Mills. Silver Linn (Tim's daughter) thanked VAST for our support during this very difficult time and thanked everyone for their love and friendship with her father.

Approval of Agenda

Rutland County moved to approve the agenda as presented, Addison County seconded. MOTION CARRIED.

Rutland County moved and Chittenden County second to add President Vacancy to the approved agenda, MOTION CARRIED.

Approval of Secretary's Report

Rutland County moved to approve the Secretary's Report as presented; Chittenden County seconded. MOTION CARRIED

Approval of Treasurer's Report

Patty Companik gave a report of the financials as of February 28, 2021. Summary of Financial Report: General budget, Trails budget, Scholarship budget January 2022 - 4 months - 33% of budget season

Income thru January 2022:

- Budget: \$3,310,443
- Monthly Activity: \$ 433.335 (394,168 from membership income)
- Income to date/season: \$2,750,252 (-560k to make budget income expectation)
- Overall income is at 83% of budgeted income expectations compared to Jan 2021 we were at 78.37%

Expense thru January 2022:

- Budget: \$2.752,476
- Monthly Activity: 175,339 (89,634 in trails expenses of which 63k was grooming payments)
- Expenses to date/season: \$733,755
- Currently at 27% of budget expense expectations compared to Jan 2021 we were at 23.56%

Chittenden County moved to approve the Treasurer's report as presented; Washington County seconded, to approve. MOTION CARRIED.

NEW BUSINESS

President's Vacancy

Cindy Locke provided an overview of the process for appointing a president when a vacancy occurs from VAST Bylaws and Policy until the next VAST Annual Meeting. Cindy Locke asked if someone is interested in the president's position. Jeff Fay said that he is interested. Jim Hill asked if someone was going to make a motion.

Washington County made the motion to appoint Jeff Fay as President of VAST; Rutland County seconded. MOTION CARRIED

Carmin Lemery inquired about the bylaw's interpretation regarding if the president is a member of each committee (voting rights) or ex-officio of VAST committees? Cindy Locke stated that the president is not allowed to chair committees as per our bylaws.

Jeff Fay said that he has already contacted two people to take over chair positions: Mark Reaves: Policy & Bylaws, Juliann Sherman: Personnel. The Trails Committee will be vacant until assigned by Jeff or Cindy. Jeff will reach out by the end of this week to fil this position. Carmin Lemery mentioned that she may have a recommendation. The Vice President position now is vacant. Mark Reaves offered himself for this position.

Orleans County moved to approve Mark Reaves for Vice President; Rutland County seconded. MOTION CARRIED

Jeff Halpin was Alternant Director and is now the new Director for Washington County.

AORRG Increase the LOC

The LOC is now \$1,250,000 for the original \$1,000,000 as requested by Vermont regulators. The breakdown of where those funds will be coming from is below.

- From Checking Account: \$850,000
- From Emergency Reserve Fund: \$300,000
- From Disaster Relief Reserve Fund: \$100,000
- From RRG Reserve Fund: \$50,000

Rutland County made the motion to increase the LOC to \$1,250,000; Chittenden County seconded. MOTION CARRIED

<u>Administration Request</u>

Cindy reminded the board of the request to the Governor for \$1M for equipment grants and \$50,000 for law enforcement. Frank Stanley is overseeing the process in the legislature. The crossover was last Friday and the Misc. DMV bill was moving from the House to the Senate. We should expect payment in the summertime.

Questions arose about what the equipment monies could be used for. Cindy stated that it would be up to the VAST Board, but that it could only be used for our equipment grant and aid programs that include new equipment or fixing old equipment.

Taiga Event (Electronic Snowmobiles)

This company is based out of Quebec, Canada. They had originally planned to launch their event in Lake Tahoe, after talking with Cindy about VAST and Vermont trails they moved the event to Stowe and will be arriving 3/1/22.

We are looking forward to this event which will be bringing media from all over the US over the course of 5 days. This is a great way to showcase snowmobiling in VT and our commitment to green initiatives.
