


~108k is GMNF Grant - so you see it in INCOME and now the offset in EXPENSE

Noticing snow-based purchasing trends with TMAs.

Reached out to other states, they are also experiencing a similar trend with their trail pass purchases. 70% of unsold TMAs are from snowmobiles registered in Vermont.

DMV Registrations

A similar trend with DMV registrations has been maintained, except for the year of COVID. DMV registrations are down this year, which is possibly weather-related or due to changes with registration sticker policy.

Noticed an increase recently via social media and calls to the VAST office of first-time visitors coming to Vermont seeking input on trail related topics, accommodations and food. VAST has been receiving feedback on Vermont being a safe place to experience snowmobiling.

<u>Club Pages on VAST Website - Cindy</u>

Reminder for clubs to update their club page on the VAST website. Information on updating club pages is included in the VAST eNews.

Looking into options of potentially adding links from the club's icon on the VAST trail map to their page on the VAST website. More information to come.

<u>Trails Administrator's / ED Report – Cindy and Matt</u>

Discussion on some of the technical difficulties experienced recently with the new GPS Units. VAST appreciates everyone's patience and is working with Alpine and AtlasTrak to resolve the issues.

VAST has been working with their host company for the VAST trail map. The trail map was temporarily down due to high traffic volume with the recent changes in early season weather.

eNews sent to clubs on Monday, 1/22 with reminders on GPS Unit placement. GPS Unit placement location needs to be visible to the horizon, or it may not provide accurate grooming data.

Discussion on switching to 2-minute from 5-minute intervals for grooming data. Currently, the program collects data every 5 minutes and calculates mileage based on an algorithm.

VAST is aware there has been some incorrect and inconsistent mileage data, which may partially be due to the GPS Unit's placement and technical issues.

Discussion on potentially transitioning grooming to hours from miles. It would be a complex transition converting to hours. More information to come.

Reminder if someone is experiencing VAST trail map difficulties to clear the browsing history and cache. Troubleshooting information has been added to the Trails tab on the VAST website.

Discussion on projected next Trails Committee meeting. Next meeting is TBD, will update when available.

Discussion on grooming appearing on some trails is shown on the VAST trail map where a trail is closed.

Discussion that club's can update trail conditions layers. A reminder that some club's trails are marked as closed due to water holes and down trees. If the groomer is used to access the trail to clear debris, it may indicate the section of trail as groomed, often the following day the club will open the trail under caution.

Cindy reached out to the Governor's office RE: a ride. Dates are TBD.

Encourage clubs to submit upcoming events to the VAST website. Events are shared in the VAST eNews.

Reminder of Ride for \$25 weekend is Friday, Jan 26 – Sunday, Jan 28.
