NEW BUSINESS

Green Mountain Sno Dogs, Lucas Lecuyer and Michael Viggiano

Green Mountain Sno Dogs is a new club in Bennington County established October 22 2023 in the prior Green Mountain Trail Blazers area.

Green Mountain Sno Dogs have voted in their officers and board of directors.

The club has been working on connecting with the local community to rebuild landowner relationships. Trail system has been unmaintained for probably 5-8 years from prior club, working hard to assess and rehabilitate trails.

Club's current revenue to date is \$3800

\$3k from private donations

\$500 club fees from TMA sales

\$300 merchandise

Projection for January 2024: \$3k in club fees from TMA sales (trending \$2k), goal of additional \$2k in private donations and \$1k in merchandise for an overall projection of \$9800.

Club recently purchased a 2000 Arctic Cat ZR440 with a 4x8 drag for \$3300 to use for grooming this season. Snowmobile will need the track replaced along with repairs and maintenance throughout the season.

Discussion of alternate grooming ideas for the club.

Club reached out to prior club regarding resources and equipment, with no return support.

Club is projecting an estimated shortfall of \$6k-\$10k based on minimum items and expenses for the season

Additional grooming sled and drag: \$8k

Bridge maintenance: \$2 (2 bridges need redecking ASAP, not flood related)

Stakes and signs: \$500

Chainsaws: \$500 Grooming Fuel: \$300

Equipment maintenance: \$500 Registration/Insurance: \$500

TOTAL: \$15,900

Club is seeking financial resources guidance and support from VAST.

Cindy shared there is currently \$21k in equipment reserves and emergency funds has about \$64k if used for flood relief.

Discussion if club could submit a flood relief application. VAST has approved \$150k over the \$750k and is still reviewing projects.

Discussion of grooming contract possibility for Class 4. VAST confirmed club does have a grooming contract and will receive a startup payment, needs to adjust to account for the 7F2 area.

Discussion on what the process is for assisting a newly established club.

Discussion if Bennington County has emergency reserves, Bennington County doesn't charge county dues.

Majority of landowner permission forms received. 7F2 landowner permission forms received, this opens options for gas and food.

Discussion on resources for equipment and contacts. Club request of \$10k to aide with expenses for a startup for the season.

Washington County: Motion to allow \$10k from emergency reserves to Green Mountain Sno Dogs to help take care of issues and expenses the club has during start up towards equipment and supplies, Windsor County seconded to approve motion as presented. MOTION CARRIED.

Discussion on process for club to communication of the need from club to VAST, request amount and documentation for auditing.

<u>Trails Administrator's / ED Report – Cindy and Matt</u>

Had the annual meeting with administration last week regarding updates with trails and flooding. Shared going to be a tight year with funding.

Future funding will go through FPR not AOT, since we already have a grant process with FPR.

Continuing to work with FEMA and SBA for the 2 Windsor County and 2 Washington County bridges, is a long process.

December BOD Meeting will be in-person on Monday, December 18 at the VAST office. Holiday meal will be provided prior to the meeting at 5:15pm, meeting to follow at 6pm. Cindy sending an email to RSVP.

Discussion if projected aren't going to be completed prior to the 12/15 deadline to contact VAST via the Trails Policy.

Grooming Contracts being sent soon. GPS units have been issued to clubs.
