ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The VAST Ambassador Safety Team Program (VSAP) is a two-part approach. The first is to offer assistance when needed on our trail system. Secondly, team members will assist clubs by identifying trail hazards, missing signs, and other issues. Ambassadors are comprised of individuals from around Vermont who share a passion for riding in our state and possess knowledge of snowmobiling, our club system, and safe riding practices. Anyone can be a VSAP Ambassador as long as they are accepted into the program and complete an annual briefing that includes information on snowmobile safety, zero-tolerance alcohol policies, familiarity with the VAST trail map, the trail phone application, the website trail map, and our Vermont Snowmobile Travelers Guide. VAST has the right to limit the VSAP each year statewide.

VSAP members may be contacted for general questions about riding in their area or may even be asked to ride with visitors unfamiliar with Vermont. All VSAP members need to have a snowmobile in good working order and legal to ride that is registered and insured. All VSAP members accepted into the program will receive one Volunteer TMA per year (and club and county dues paid by VAST) for their sled, a safety vest to wear, and necessary tools and signs to carry. VSAP members should possess an outgoing personality and a positive attitude about riding in Vermont. They should be prepared not only to discuss their own club and trails but also to promote other clubs and regions in Vermont in a positive light. When acting as a VSAP member and wearing your safety vest, you must follow all Vermont laws, including not drinking and snowmobiling, riding reasonably and prudently, providing assistance when needed, and completing online log sheets. VSAP members must also complete a code of conduct agreement and adhere to its terms.
